## Honour for CII Adviser

Mr. K P Nyati, Principal Adviser, CII, has been honoured by Dr Manmohan Singh, Prime Minister of India, for his contribution to the work of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC). At a special function hosted by him on 26 November, to felicitate Indian Scientists who have

contributed to the work of IPCC, Dr Singh honoured the entire team headed by Dr R K Pachauri, Director General of The Energy Resources Institute (TERI), for its efforts to build up and disseminate greater knowledge about man-made climate change and to lay the foundation for the measures that are needed to counteract such change.

The IPCC, a UN body comprised of about 3,000 atmospheric scientists, oceanographers, ice specialists, economists and other experts, is the world's top scientific authority on global warming and its impact.

The Norwegian Nobel Committee has awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for 2007 to be shared, in two equal parts, between the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and Albert Arnold (AL) Gore Jr. Former US Vice President for the work on climate change.
